Letter to the Editor

It is time for property owners around the Great Sacandaga Lake to speak out about the problem of excessive boat speed and noise around our lake. I attended the annual meeting of the Great Sacandaga Lake Association on August 17. It was obvious to me that boat speed and noise are two of the major concerns of those in the Association.

I applaud Sheriff Giardino for his pledge to obtain noise-measuring devices and train law enforcement personnel in their operation. The law is clear that there is a statewide noise limit of 90 decibels on New York waters, and this is a step in the right direction in enforcing that law (Section 44 of the Navigation Law). Additionally, we should be aware of the law banning certain mufflers and straight pipes.

There was discussion at the meeting about boats coming to the Sacandaga from Lake George to take advantage of our lack of a speed limit and our lack of noise enforcement. Lake George has speed limits of 45 mph from 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. and 25 mph from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. If we were to adopt the same limits, then the noise issue could be substantially less.

The speed and noise issue on our lake is not only a quality of life issue, but a safety issue. The Town of Day does have a 45 mph speed limit, so a speed limit on the Sacandaga is not a new issue.

As a Councilman for the Town of Northampton I have received numerous complaints over the past few years about the loud boats on our end of the lake. I have asked our attorney for an opinion on speed and noise laws. I intend to follow up on this issue. I suggest that GSL property owners contact their Supervisors and Councilmen and ask them to consider looking into the speed and noise issue. Perhaps other local legislators will also want to do something, as we are looking at a question of safety and quality of life.

Sheriff Giardino made a good point about calling law enforcement when you see or hear a violation. Although they may not be able to answer your call with a patrol, your call will be logged into the docket for future reference.





EDINBURG VOL. FIRE CO.

Alarm reports for this article are from June, 28th, through July 21st,

2018. The Company responded to a total of eight calls during this time period. Of these three were mutual aid, (Northville 2, Providence 1). motor vehicle accident 1. brush fire 1. EMS assist 1. Good Intent 1, vehicle fire 1.

In our on going account of the history of the Edinburg Fire Department we briefly take a look at the seventies and eighties. Like many rural departments which had their start in the decade or so in the post war years, Edinburg enjoyed a period of expansion. This included putting on an addition to the original firehouse in 1971. With this more and better apparatus could roll to a call.

Membership in the eighties still remained high. However one could start to see changes in personnel, as naturally some of the original members of 1957 began to step aside. To badly paraphrase General Douglas McArthur in his farewell address to Congress; Old Firefighters never die, they just fade away. The Company continues on.

Fire suppression is our business, however fire prevention is also yours. There are many simply steps you can take to make your home a safer place. One is to have at least one fire extinguisher on each level of your home. Typically an extinguisher that is labeled "ABC" will provide you with adequate coverage.

There are plenty of videos one can watch on the internet to see how they best operate. If none of your family members know the proper operation of an extinguisher, what is the point in having them?

They may do more than just put the fire out, they may be the only means of providing you with a path to exit your home in the event of a fully involved structure fire. I personally recommend at least a five pound extinguisher. Better to have something larger and not have to use it all, than run out. Most importantly, if you have the time – dial 911. If not, just get out. Most everything can be replaced – you can't be.







A Report from the Great Sacandaga Lake Association

Every year the Great Sacandaga Lake Association holds an Annual Membership Meeting. We never missed a meeting until last year when we were forced to reschedule because of a TORNADO on the lake. This year our meeting was scheduled for August 17 and we asked our members to pray for good weather. Well, we were almost rewarded! On the 17th, we had heavy rain and thunder but NO Tornado! We had a great meeting and a great time.

I thank our general membership and our Board as well as invited speakers: Fulton County Sheriff Richard Giardino who was also representing Saratoga County Sheriff Michael Zurlo, Hudson River-Black River Regulating District Interim Executive Director John Hodgson and Sacandaga Protection Committee Representative Doug Sterling. Our intent every year is to share Association information including the results of the voting on new Board members and this year we also reported on the passage of by-law changes. We also invite speakers to address current lake topics. This year our topics included boater safety, lake levels and an update on the legislative proposal S7957A.

BOATER SAFETY ON THE GREAT SACANDAGA

Our members this summer were concerned about boat speed and noise as well as the possibility of instituting speed limits such as that passed in the Town of Day. The Sheriff discussed the difficulty of operating lake patrols because of staffing. He requested that members report non-emergency situations to either of the Sheriff Departments using their non-emergency telephone numbers. He indicated that both Departments work closely to address the issues and will share calls.

He emphasized the '100 foot from shore or moored vessel less than 5 mph speed limit' is in place lakewide and reminded individuals that they may take photos of boat registration decals and send them to the Fulton County Sheriff FACEPAGE

to help in their reporting. The Sheriff indicated that he will discuss general speed issues as well as the speed limit under the Batchellerville Bridge and the training of Deputies to operate a sound decibel meter both on the water and dockside with his staff and colleagues. In closing, he reported on the contributions of the Sean Craig Memorial Fund, the Henry Ross Memorial Fund, the GSLA and the SAFE Lake Initiative in addressing boater safety on the lake.

LAKE LEVEL ON THE GREAT SACANDAGA

Members were concerned about



the low water level on the lake this summer and specifically questioned why the water was being released from the dam for white water rafting. John Hodgson from the Regulating District provided information about the Settlement Agreement which controls the release of the water. He emphasized that negotiations were conducted during the Federal relicensing process and included many signatories including the white water rafters. David Smail, GSLA Vice-President and Chair of the Water Level Committee shared a water level graph and spoke to the fact that the water level on the lake has actually on average been higher than before the settlement. Peter Byron reported that the GSLA provides information on the water level to membership and works closely with the Regulating District on the issue. He commented that coordination has been excellent and that the GSLA will develop a 'primer' on lake level which will describe the Settlement Agreement and the signatories.





Doug Sterling provided membership with an update on the status of the bill (S7957A) which is awaiting signature by the Governor. He noted that the bill has not yet been sent to the Governor's Office for his review and signature. Doug spoke about the potential impact on property values on the lake and the potential adverse impact on residents who are not lake access permit holders. He requested that members support the Sacandaga Protection Committee (SPC) and recommended that they should communicate their position on the bill to the Governor's Office.

Doug Sterling mentioned the fact that many lake access permit holders are not members of the SPC. Members recommended that the SPC request an updated address list from the Regulating District in order to reach these individuals.

A Call for Involvement

Our Association had a great Annual Membership Meeting on August 17. However, the most important part of the meeting was the fact that we were privileged to have representatives from the Sheriff's Office, the Regulating District and the Sacandaga Protection Committee take time



most common complaints of chronic pain stem from headaches, lower back problems, cancer, arthritis and damage to nerves. The AAPM estimates that over 1.5 billion people suffer from chronic pain worldwide, with the top three leading causes resulting from low back pain, severe headache or migraine, and neck pain.

DID YOU KNOW THAT—

by Town of Edinburg Historian, Priscilla L. Edwards

During the Civil War and probably most of the wars since many young women wrote letters to soldiers to encourage them and make them feel closer to home. Many of the letters were written to soldiers from the same area as the women who wrote them. Hearing news from their hometown certainly cheered up the soldiers but the writer was unknown as most of the women used an assumed name.

Mahitable Copeland, 1847-1907, nickname, Hettie was one of these women. She was a daughter of Arad and Ann Eliza Copeland, living in the brick house in Beecher Hollow across the road from our current Copeland covered bridge. As a young woman she had been injured in a buggy accident and could not do heavy housework. She owned and operated a millinery shop-all women and girls wore hats back then- in her parents home giving her a source of income.

The following is one of the letters that Hettie—she used the assumed name "Loly" wrote to Civil War

soldiers. She often sat under a pine tree on the hillside across from the brick house to write her letters.

"My friend,

I am going to give you a brief description of my school, my home and myself though I cannot tell how interesting it may be, yet it will be a true one.

I have attended a boarding school for young ladies in a neighboring village one pronounced good by competent judges. I will tell you how I spent a portion of this vacation. My most intimate friend Nellie Arthers and myself were appointed missionary collectors. pleasant than we anticipated. At least the minister gave the welcome words "well done" and promised each a steel plate engraving as reward.

School starts soon again. My studies I believe are the same that young ladies usually pursue. (Think I like Hirkmans grammar and Adams Arithmetic the best). They are so practical and romantic.

Now about my home. It is a wild picturesque place, strangers sometime call it lonely, but tis the dearest spot on earth to me. Just imagine yourself seated in a place called the pines. In front of you is a ravine, at the foot of which runs a murmuring brook. Beyond this on the hillsides are scattered cheerful looking farm houses. At your right across the brook stands the Congregational Church, an ancient wooden structure. I cannot tell of what type of architecture. Beyond this the Sacandaga like a thread of silver, winds around among the mountains of the Adirondac range, and the intervals are dotted by comfortable dwellings, barns, etc. On the placid water of this river runs a small steamer called The Colonel". Back of you across the river, distant about half a mile is the village of Batchellerville noted for the manufacture of "measures" as half bushels. At your left in range at a short distance is the Hotel. Methodist Church, several other buildings, the last but not least is voices of friends as every morningsweet and clear it says, "come to school". Significant News for September

We are pleased and proud to present the full text of an article published in the worldwide publication of the Presbyterian Church, USA by our pastor, Rebecca Lawson Putman. The full article is reprinted below with permission of the magazine, "Presbyterians Today/"

We are all ministers by Rebecca Lawson Putman First Published in "Presbyterians Today"

As we approach the fall kickoff to the church program year, my thoughts keep coming back to the Protestant idea of the priesthood of all believers. This doctrine teaches that because of Jesus Christ, there is no need for someone to act as a mediator between the people and God. Everyone is just as spiritual, just as capable of speaking to God, and just as called to deliver God's message to the world. Everyone is equally called to do God's work and to minister to God's people.

The question, though, that many of the people in the church I serve ask is, "What does ministering look like if you're not a minster?" The answer is complex, and it looks different for different people, but the short answer is that it looks like you serving others and showing God's love as you go about your daily life.

The best example I have of this is a story of John and Raul. In 1986, they worked at the corporate headquarters of a retail chain in New York City. They were both supervisors and frequently spent 12-hour shifts working together. They developed a friendship. Eventually, John was promoted to manager. One day,

John noticed Raul had a lesion on his right cheek and that he hadn't been feeling well. Raul went to see a doctor in June and went out on disability. In August, Raul asked if he could come back to work, though he would need some accommodations because of his health. John, John's boss and the vice president of the human resources department all agreed. However, Raul's coworkers soon learned that Raul had been diagnosed with AIDS. They were afraid and angry that he was coming back to work.

The first morning when Raul came into work, John walked out of his office, smiled, shook Raul's hand and told him how glad he was that he was back. As the weeks passed, Raul continued to grow weaker until he went out again on disability in October.

When Raul died that December, John and his boss attended Raul's funeral, which surprised and touched Raul's partner. When John recounted this story to me, he said that he still remembers the sound of Raul's voice and the look of his face. John also mentioned that in retrospect, he's amazed that he and the company were so willing to stand by Raul to the end, especially given the fears about AIDS at that time.

The story about John and Raul is an example of what it means to be a priest amid our daily lives. John was just doing what he thought was right. He would never describe what he did as something godly, Christlike or priestly. Like the lepers in Jesus' time, Raul was visibly marked as ill by the lesion on his face. People didn't want to work with Raul, let alone touch him. But John accepted Raul with an outstretched hand. In that moment, John proclaimed God's message to Raul loud and clear: You are my beloved child. John's handshake and smile delivered a more perfect sermon than even the most gifted preacher on her best Sunday.

How we can minister to each other will look different in our various contexts. Few stories will be quite like that of John and Raul. In my congregation, we seem to do a good job of taking care of each other. We'll work out a schedule so that the person whose loved one is ill is never alone at the hospital. We bring



meals to those recovering from surgery. We show up and eat cake with someone celebrating his birthday after coming through a major health scare a few months before. We show someone who has lost her spouse how to do the chores that her spouse had always done. We visit those in our community who are lonely, even if they have no direct connection to our congregation. The thing that gives me the most joy as the pastor is, I don't normally organize these things. They aren't a planned initiative to live out our faith. We're just a bunch of people wanting to live out our faith.

When people from my congregation ask what it looks like to minister if you aren't a minister, I smile and say it looks a lot like what they're already doing.

Welcome students, staff, parents and guardians to the 2018-2019 school year. The staff and I are planning, smiling, creating and our classrooms and hallways are once again buzzing with dedicated staff putting final touches on their classrooms and opening lessons. The one thing we are still missing as of this publication are the sounds of our children. I always say that the school is not truly a school until the hallways and classrooms are filled with our children talking, smiling, questioning, sharing and ready to learn.

DATES TO REMEMBER:

Students in grades K-2 are invited to stop by the school from 2:30-3:00 on September 4, 2018 to drop off their school supplies and take a sneak peak at their classroom. We look forward to formally welcoming all of our students K-6 back to school on September 5, 2018. Please note that Edinburg students in grades 7-12 will not start until September 6, 2018.

are better able to thrive in their learning community. Each staff member, board member and administrator understands that we "teach" individuals and every student in this district is a little human being with rights, opinions, interests, feelings and needs. We know that their individual needs socially and emotionally must be met in order for them to be achieve to their academic potential.

So what exactly can we do as parents and educators to nurture a love of learning in our children? The first thing we can do is to really listen to our children. Take time to discover their interests. We can invite questions and then follow up with additional questions that emerge from that initial question asked by the child. "What else do you want to know?", "What else does that make you think of?" "Interesting idea, I like that question." One of the things we can do is to work on refraining from answering their questions and instead, encourage them to think about answers by asking "What do you think?", "Why do you think that happened?" "How do you think you might find that out." The more we encourage questions, give our children choices and provide opportunities for them to explore, discuss and grapple with answers to their questions, the more we are nurturing a love of learning and building selfconfidence in our children.

Young children are naturally curious and they have a built-in desire to learn about the world around them. Young children are interested in finding out what things work, they are open, perceptive and experimental. As children mature we need to continue to nurture these traits. True conceptual learning does not happen without both interest and engagement. Memorization for the moment may happen and we may perceive that as true learning but that is not sustainable, long-term mastery.

Nurturing a love of learning does not always mean fun, play and laughter. Rigorous learning can be frustrating, it can and should be challenging. Sometimes a child is frustrated because they are working hard to try and "figure something out" and even as adults we can relate to how stressful and annoying that process can be. We need to encourage, support and guide in these situations but never force. Always try to gauge if this is a frustration that is appropriate and the child is developmentally capable of continuing or if is this a frustration that is beyond the child's developmental capability or ability to achieve and could lead to shut down or avoidance in the future as that could cause long term dislike of the content for the child.

Once we discover the interests of our children. we can help them explore those interests by finding and engaging with them in books, games, resources, websites, movies, outings etc.... We can subtly leave things related to their interests in places where it can catch their attention and see what they do or what new questions arise. Modeling and engaging with children can further motivate and help them to feel comfortable exploring, making mistakes. Most importantly, it shows children that learning is important to the adults in their life. Remember that our children look up to us and adults and take their cues from us. When they look up, don't we want them to be surrounded by adults both in and out of school that are modeling the attitudes, behaviors and practices that we want them to become as learners and citizens?
