
On Thursday, December 11th the Garden Club members literally traveled through a winter wonderland to the Northville Public Library. This

#### You're Breathing All Wrong

"We all come into the world with the ability to take full, deep breaths, but as we get older we forget how to breathe properly." says Don Campbell, a journalist turned wellness expert who champions a new movement among doctors and athletes known as "conscious breathing. "Poor posture, restrictive clothing, bad habits such as smoking, bad diets that lead to high blood pressure and racing hearts, emotionally stressful lives, lack of exercise, multitasking, polluted environments, and slouching in front of computers are just a few of the things that literally take our breath away. The average person only uses about a third of his natural lung capacity and draws about 15 breaths a minute.

"Up until the past 100 or 150 years, our daily activities – farm chores, hunting animals, hard manual labor – required that we use our diaphragms as our main breathing muscle," says Dr. Louis Libby, a pulmonary physician at the Oregon Clinic, in Portland. "In the past century we've become sedentary. We can go days without using our diaphragms. We've become lazy, sitting

in front of computers and using the weaker intercostal breathing muscles in the rib cage for breaths that are incomplete but adequate for living."

By practicing yoga and studying current scientific reports, Campbell discovered that 10 or fewer deeper, slower breaths per minute is best for overall health. "The main physiological benefit to slower breathing is that it increases oxygen saturation in cells, this unleashes a cascade of positive effects, including giving you more energy and increased cognitive abilities."

Perhaps more important, slow breathing tends to increase heart-rate variability, a measurement of the fluctuation in heartbeat during an activity. "If your heart rate fluctuates between 60 to 80 beats per minute, cardiac-wise that's healthier than someone whose heart rate varies between only 70 and 75 beats per minute," It means your system is not so rigid.

Professional athletes have a massive swing in heart-rate variability, whereas an unhealthy or older person has a much smaller one. The way to increase variability is to breathe slowly."



try. Do this five or six times a day to start, trust me, you'll notice your body functioning better. You may feel your focus improving, the tightness in your neck and shoulders relaxing, your energy improving and an overall better sense of well being.

Relearn How To Breathe

- 1. Place one hand on your belly and one hand on your heart
- 2. Inhale deeply into the belly
- 3. Exhale with a short burst (as if blowing out a candle) to activate

your diaphragm continue exhaling with a long slow finish to

completely empty your lungs

- 4. Inhale, slowly filling your lungs from your belly to your heart
- 5. Hold for a moment to allow oxygen to saturate the cells.
- 6. Exhale slowly and completely.
- 7. Repeat steps 4 through 6 for five minutes.

Do this exercise five times a day and you'll start

thinking and feeling better in no time

#### Changes to Recycling Program

The recyclables collected by the Town of Edinburg are taken to the county regional recycling site in Corinth. Beginning toward the end of February Saratoga County will transition to a system known as "Single-Stream". The county has awarded a contract to County Waste to transport, sort and market the recyclables. County Waste will take the items to an automated separation facility and then market the items and the county will receive some revenue. This process will save the county several hundred as the town collects recycling at road side all of the items in the blue boxes will be placed together into

the truck. If you bring your recycling to the center it will all go into one compartment of the truck without being sorted. Residents who place items at curbside will not do anything differently.

#### Town Insurance

The town has received notification from our liability insurance carrier, the New York Municipal Insurance Reciprocal, that our rates will remain the same for 2015. The Reciprocal is owned by local governments and works very hard to hold down costs and this has resulted in substantial savings which are returned to the members in the form of lower rates.

#### Body Cameras for Sheriff's Department

The County Public Safety Committee has formed a subcommittee to study the possibility of providing body cameras for deputies. Items that will be considered include positive attributes, concerns, storage of data, use of data, policies and procedures with camera use, experience of other policing departments and costs.



The Library's award winning Local History & Genealogy Project continues to develop and is now in its tenth year. Parts of the project can be found on the library's website under the tab "Library Activities – Genealogy".

The main part of the project has been the establishment of "Sacandaga Families", a genealogical research tool that creates family trees for those that have lived around the Sacandaga Valley from the 1700's forward, including the Towns of Northampton, Hope, Benson,

Wells, Edinburg, Day, Providence, Mayfield, and Broadalbin. The database has over 32,500 names and is synced to Ancestry.com, allowing it to be

viewed all over the world. This is an ongoing project.

The Sacandaga Book Group will meet on Tuesday, Feb 10 at 10 am in the library's program room. Marge Decker will lead discussion of "Cane River" by Lalita Tademy. The novel tells the story of four generations of African-American women and the choices they made in order to survive slavery and tragic losses, and to create a legacy for the generations to follow.


On Tuesday, Feb 24 (6 - 730pm), Library Bingo will be held in the program room. This program is

Johnstown artist, Tyler Schrader will exhibit his oil paintings at the Northville Public Library located on 341 S. Third St. from now till February 26th . The exhibit will be open during library hours: 9-noon Mon/Fri/Sat, 9-8 Tues, 9-4 Wed/ Thurs

Tyler lives in Johnstown, NY and is currently a student at Fulton Montgomery Community College studying fine arts. He is a 2013 graduate of Johnstown High School and credits his art teacher, Roberta Fariello with launching his motivation in fine art. Tyler is just getting his feet wet in the art scene. He had his first solo show in September 2014 at the American Hotel, Sharon Springs, NY where he displayed his series "Blue".

Tyler is currently working with a regional artist, Jon Swartwout, learning the art of designing and building Adirondack rustic furniture. This experience influenced his series "Blue", and more specifically, his work with frames. Tyler has taken his acquired skills and applied them to his frame designs resulting in a pleasing combination, seeing both the painting and the frame as an interconnected whole. Right now he is working on his next series, "Miniature World" based on a group of his miniature photos. He will be displaying this series during the summer of 2015.



#### DID YOU KNOW THAT—

by Town of Edinburg Historian, Priscilla L. Edwards

The first half of the 1940's saw little business activity around the Edinburg 4-Corners. Our young men were off to war while those left behind were doing their best to help their families and the war effort here at home. Shortly after the war things started to pick up.

In July 1946 Al Boudreau and his wife Beatrice of Northville purchased for \$500, the second lot west from the Methodist Church from Harold and Rosina Wessels. A few months later-Boudreau's Garage was born.

Eldon "Al" Boudreau was born in Inverness, New Brunswick into a family of over a dozen siblings. In 1927 Al, his friend the late Ed Arsenault along with 2 others came to our area to work on the Sacandaga Reservoir project. Al's job was clearing the land by cutting trees and burning buildings.

With the completion of the reservoir Al decided to stay in the area but needed to find work. For a short time he worked in the cities of Gloversville

and Johnstown delivering ice; then worked at the car dealership, H&P Motors in Gloversville, From there he came back to Northville to work at Mert Rhodes garage(now Esler's) on S. Main Street. Al's work at Rhodes eventually advanced him from mechanic to manager.

In 1938 Al married Beatrice Roblee of Northville. The newlyweds moved into the Roblee family home on S. Main in the village 2 doors south of the Methodist Church. (See the Northville-Northampton Historical Society's January newsletter for more on this house.)

Al and Bea raised 3 children in this home: Louise Melise, Philip and Cheryl Eileen. Bea passed away in 1972. The house was torn down in 1988 and replaced with a new smaller home.

Al started his own garage in 1946 using the same layout as Rhodes garage except he never installed a restroom or a portico out front. Al and Ed Arsenault did all the cement block and concrete work on the building.

Boudreau's Garage started as an Esso gas station, changing to Getty in 1972 and remaining this until Getty went out of business in New York State in about 1997. The physical building is still the same except for a small addition built on several years ago to "square up" the building.

The large overhead door was a design of Al's own creation. It ran into the attic section of the building with a Model A transmission to power the motor that ran a combination of gears and cables. The door is still in the ceiling –still in working condition-having been replaced with a more modern door.


Anyone needing tools and equipment shortly after WWII had the opportunity to acquire supplies from army surplus which is what Al did.

Welders, drill presses, grinders and whatever other necessary equipment was purchased from army surplus at a great savings.

Two things of interest are in the back of the building over the original work bench. Hanging at the end of an older electrical cord is a light bulb that has hung there since the building was built, never having been replaced. The bulb gives off a distinct yellowish glow much different than today's bulbs. On the wall above the bulb is a metal sun, painted vellow, made from a wheel rim by Al's son, Phil.

Like many men from his generation Al Boudreau was very talented when it came to repairing or rebuilding all kinds of equipment. He was an expert welder, building his own forge and hardening steel with the best of them. If he couldn't buy a tool or a part he needed-he made one. As friends Ed Arsenault, Paul Bradt, Vic Brownell and Robert Clark started their own businesses. Al became the "go to" guy for machinery installation and repairs.

Al repaired the Edinburg Common School buses from "day 1" until 1990-always making bus repairs the priority. The town highway trucks and equipment were also repaired for over 30 years. Log trucks and customers' vehicles completed the work load, keeping the garage full every day.

In 1959 upon graduation from NCS Al's son, Phil, started work at the garage. Phil went into



Al's grandson Bobby Clemons started full time at the garage in 1990, although Bobby will tell you "he's been there every single day since Oct. 1973-when he was only 3 years old". As soon as old enough he'd do odd jobs about the garage. When he got his driver's license he played "gopher", chasing parts as far as Albany and Roosevelt & Son in

Canajoharie. Bobby also jockeyed school buses back and forth to the school bus garage-legally-as long as he covered up the words "school bus" on the vehicle.

A great place for men to gather- many stories of events have circulated around Boudreau's garage in the past 70 years-some can be repeated, others not. One I especially like is how the stately outhouse out back was moved over from Northville.

Shortly after garage completion in 1946 an outhouse was needed and the Northville Methodist Church had one available. Al and his friend Clarence LaPrairie-Clarence had been in charge of the "outdoor crew" when Al worked on the reservoir project-put their heads together and decided the building could be moved.

The building was jacked up; 18" diameter logs placed underneath for rollers, a village truck was borrowed and the two headed for Edinburg. The story goes that the logs were worn down 4" in diameter when the outhouse was placed in its new location. It's also told that the state trooper in charge of village law enforcement coincidently received a phone call of an emergency in Wells at the same time that Al and Clarence were headed for Edinburg. The outhouse has its original siding, is still in use; only the roof having been replaced.

Al Boudreau passed away Nov. 1, 2004, one month short of his 101st birthday. Bobby Clemons took over the garage a short time before his Uncle Phil's death on June 10, 2010.

Since Bobby was always at the garage hanging out with his grandfather and uncle he gradually gained the name "Bobby Boudreau" from friends and fellow firemen." Bobby Boudreau" is on the new sign recently erected out front. With help from his wife Andrea, Bobby still offers gas and diesel fuel along with vehicle maintenance and repairs.

How good to see a business of 70 years still in the family!

### Cornell University Cooperative Extension Saratoga County

NY Forest Owners Association SE Adirondack Chapter to Host Presentation on Deer Impacts in Woodlots and Suburban Landscapes

The Southeastern Adirondack Chapter (SAC) of the New York Forest Owners Association (NYFOA) will host a presentation titled Deer Impacts in Woodlots and Suburban Landscapes given by Dr. Paul D. Curtis on Saturday, January 31, 2015 at the Crandall Library in Glens Falls, NY. Dr. Curtis has coordinated the Wildlife Damage Management Program for Cornell University Cooperative Extension during the past 25 years. His research interests include human-wildlife conflicts in suburban, forested, and agricultural landscapes, wildlife fertility control, and resolving community-based wildlife issues.

Dr. Curtis' presentation will discuss how detrimental deer impacts on forest ecosystems are evident across a range of deer densities and forest habitats in New York State (NYS). Foresters practicing in New York estimated that forest regeneration, in stands opened up for regeneration, was moderately or highly successful only 30% of the time. They identified deer browsing and interfering vegetation as a primary cause of the problem. Development of standardized assessment protocols for deer browse impacts on forest regeneration (e.g. seedling density, composition, recruitment) is needed to improve our understanding and documentation of forest health and deer impacts in various regions and habitats in New York. Through a partnership between NYS DEC, SUNY-ESF, and Cornell Cooperative Extension (CCE), researchers are currently working to identify appropriate indicators and monitoring approaches to assess deer impacts on forests and compile existing data on forest condition in New York. They will then develop a mobile device application to aid in collection of vegetation and deer impact data by volunteers and professional partners.

Dr. Curtis' presentation will start at 2 PM in the Crandall Public Library Community Room following the Chapter's annual meeting. All members are welcome to attend the annual meeting that starts at 10 AM. The afternoon presentation is open to the general public, free of charge. Members will be available for more information regarding the organization, its activities, and benefits for those that are interested.

NYFOA has over 1800 members across NYS. The SAC has over 180 members across Saratoga, Warren, Washington, Hamilton, and Fulton counties. The

chapter regularly has woodswalks for enjoying the outdoors and discussing woodland owner experiences and sharing information with other members. There are many opportunities to share information across the state with other chapters as well. Chapters also publish newsletters to keep members informed of activities, share ideas and present new forest related practices. STAY SAFE THIS WINTER

Winter weather can definitely be frightful! There are things you can do to be better prepared for winter weather situations. Making good choices is one way to stay safe, such as staying indoors when it is extremely cold and windy, or staying outside for just a short time if you must go out. When you do go outside, wearing layers, hats, gloves, scarves, coat, and boots helps prevent frost bite, which is damage to the body from the cold that can affect a person from the skin to the bone. Cheeks, ears, nose, fingers, chin, and toes are at the greatest risk of frost bite so be sure to cover up all areas of your body when heading outside.

Here are some other tips for staying safe this winter:

#### Walking

Be sure walkways are cleared, shoveled, salted,

and free from ice. If not, find a different path. Purchase shoe grips and cane grips to help you stay steady on icy or snowy grounds.

Re-purpose empty parmesan cheese shakers by filling them with sand or salt. Take one with you wherever you go and sprinkle the sand or salt whenever you feel you need it.

#### Driving

Keep a coffee can or bucket filled with sand or salt in your car.

If it is very cold, windy, snowing, or if the roads are icy, stay home.

Plan ahead by stocking up on things you need, and running errands on good weather days. Make sure your car is ready for winter. When you have your oil changed, ask the mechanic to also check the anti-freeze, windshield wipers, and tires, and have them replaced if needed.

Be sure to have a blanket, extra hat, gloves, and a sweatshirt in your car for an emergency, along with a shovel, flashlight, snow brush, and even a first-aid kit.

#### Communication

Always take your cellphone with you in case of an emergency. If you don't have one, consider



purchasing a pay-as-you-go phone that requires you to buy inexpensive "minute cards" or "airtime" periodically.

When traveling, arrange to check in with someone when you have arrived at your destination. That person can also call to check on you if they have not heard from you.

#### At Home: Outside and Inside

Make sure your walkways are cleared, sanded or salted, and properly lit.

If you are shoveling, be mindful of your body. Shoveling snow can be hard work. Talk to your doctor to be sure that this is something that you can do safely. If you are not able to do this on your own, ask a neighbor, friend, local Boy Scout troop, etc. to assist you.

Check the batteries on smoke detectors and carbon-monoxide detectors. Make sure your fire extinguisher is in working condition. If you do not have one, consider purchasing one that can be used in a variety of fires.

Always have a lantern, flashlight, plenty of blankets, non-perishable food, and bottled water

on hand in the event of a power outage. Make arrangements ahead of time to stay with family or friends if there is an extended power outage.

Have a list of emergency numbers by the phone for your use as well as a list of your emergency contacts posted somewhere visible, such as the refrigerator.

The winter months can be a beautiful time of year, but winter can also be dangerous if you are not taking the proper precautions to stay safe. Be sure to check in with family and friends on a regular schedule, make good decisions, bundle up when going out, and have a safe and happy winter!



Miscellaneous Ice Fishing Rules and Regulations Anglers are allowed to use up to three lines and five tip-ups except as noted in special regulations for specific waters. No person shall operate a tip-up that has more than 5 lures or baits or a combination of both, or has more than 15 hook points in any combination of single, double or treble hooks.

Ice shanties must be marked on the outside with the owner's name and address in letters at least 3 inches high. Shanties must be removed from all waters by March 15 to prevent them from falling through the ice in spring and becoming navigational hazards

It is illegal on New York State waters to possess walleye, black bass, brook trout, lake trout or Atlantic salmon that have been cut, dismembered, filleted, skinned or otherwise altered so that the species and total length of such fish cannot be easily determined. However, these fish may be gilled or gutted. Other species of fish may be filleted provided that the skin is not removed from the fillets. This regulation allows more effective enforcement of harvest regulations on protected game fish.

It is illegal to discard any fish carcass, or parts thereof, into the freshwaters of the state within 100 feet of shore or upon any public or private lands contiguous to and within 100 feet of such water, except:

On private lands by owners of such lands. If properly disposing into suitable garbage or refuse collection systems or by burial.

Where incidental cleaning of fish for consumption is permitted. However, resulting waste may not be disposed of within 100 feet of any public launching or docking site unless into a suitable refuse collection system.

Live fish and fish which must be returned to the water because of size limits, open seasons and creel limits are not subject to the fish carcass disposal law.

#### Don't be Snookered!

Have you ever been snookered? When my husband and I were newlyweds this very nice man told us how we could buy anything we wanted at a much lower price; "practically wholesale" he said. And we could also purchase all of our cleaning products at amazingly low prices, if we just joined this wonderful program he was promoting. It was so easy, and made so much sense. We would be crazy to say no to this awesome offer. (Yes, we were being snookered.) Since we were young and naïve, we believed him and signed on the dotted line. Can you relate to our experience? As they say, "If something sounds too good to be true, it probably is!"

Or perhaps you have received the same email that I have saying that a doctor from Naiobi is having trouble getting money out of his country. If only I would give him my bank account information, I could help him. I could wire money for him, less the 10 percent fee for my services, which he would happily pay me for helping him out. Scams like this happen all the time! (They even have the nerve to ask for our Social Security numbers!) Many times these people prey on our emotions and compassion. I am especially angry when I hear of the elderly in our community being targeted by these wolves in sheep clothing.

I'm sad to say that this also happens in some churches. We need to be careful not to be snookered spiritually. The Bible gives a strong warning in the book of Acts to pastors, our spiritual overseers; "Keep watch over yourselves and all the flock of which the Holy Spirit has made you overseers. Be shepherds of the church of God, which he bought with his own blood. I know that after I leave, savage wolves will come in among you and will not spare the flock. Even from your own number men will arise and distort the truth in order to draw away disciples after them." I hope none of us will be drawn away from the truth by such people. This is a good reminder for us to pray for our spiritual leaders to stay close to God and His Word, so they continue to guard us and lead us in the truth.

In January our church sent a Missions Team to Mali, Africa for three weeks. The team reported that Mali was very careful regarding the Ebola crisis, taking every person's temperature at the airport, and making sure that they check their temperatures every day while they were in Mali. Upon their return the

team must also take their temperatures every day for the next three weeks.

Our team was glad for the opportunity to assist our faithful missionaries, Rich and Anna Marshall, who have been serving in Mali for over 20 years now. (Rich's parents, Frank and Eleanor Marshall, who are retired missionaries of Timbuktu, Mali now live in Perth NY.) While in Mali Pastor Klueg taught at a Bible Institute (with a translator, of course) for one week, while Shawn Darling and Bill Donnan worked on needed repairs at the mission and college. The guys did small jobs like fixing a child's teeter totter and a broken wheel barrow, besides larger projects such as building beds for students, welding broken parts, and working on whatever other projects our missionaries gave them. Pastor Klueg had the opportunity to preach at a small village church. They also worshipped with a local congregation at a large Baptist Church in Bamako, the capitol city. (If you have facebook, type Richard Klueg on the search line, and you can see pictures of their trip and view a short video to hear an African church choir at this Baptist Church, the largest church in the country we were told.) Our Mali Team also flew on the UN plane to Timbuktu to view the mission work there and to encourage the believers in this Al-Qaida torn city. I was there just three years ago with my husband, before the coup took place in Mali. I was very impressed with the work there and so glad that this team could go there to help them as they are still in recovery. Timbuktu is located on the edge of the Sahara Desert. When I was touring there I saw small groups on camels travelling across the desert sands, making me feel as though I had gone back in time. (I could almost hear music from the movie, Casablanca.) The team also visited the city of Gao where there is a small Bible Institute which trains pastors and spiritual leaders for the country. Upon their return the team will share about their trip to Africa, showing pictures and giving details about their work and adventures. If you would like to hear their presentation, call the church office at 863.8001 to find out the date and time. I personally can hardly wait to hear what they have to share!

We would love to have you join us this Sunday at Northville Baptist. We have a staffed nursery for your babies and preschoolers, a dedicated Praise Band, Youth Choir and Adult Choir who lead us in worship, and a Jr. Church time downstairs for the younger crowd during the sermon in the sanctuary. Include all parts of the hands – front, back, fingernails, between fingers, etc.


Wash hands often – especially before eating. Soap and water work best.
