



#### Memorial Day Flags

American Flags are being placed on light poles and in the cemeteries at Veterans graves for Memorial Day. They will be left up until after Veterans Day in November. Jean and Todd Becker volunteer every year to place the Veterans flags in our cemeteries and the Highway Department does the electric poles, Town Hall and Four Corners monument. Thanks to all and to all of our veterans for their service.

Saratoga County and Town of Edinburg Fish Stocking

Saratoga County and the Towns around the lake, including Edinburg, again this year purchased Rainbow Trout for stocking. They were stocked in various locations in the Great



Sacandaga Lake on May 15th. Children from Edinburg and Northville schools helped put fish into the lake at the NYS Boat Launch in the Town of Day. Jason Kemper, who is Director of Planning for Saratoga County and an Edinburg resident, oversees the stocking program, among his many other responsibilities. Smaller trout were also stocked in streams that feed into the lake on the same day. Thanks to all who participated and helped.

#### Mosquito Dunks

Saratoga County purchased a supply of mosquito dunks and distributed them to the towns and villages. They will be given out on a first come basis. They are meant for standing water, not roadside ditches or running water. They should not be used anywhere in proximity to a drinking water source or where water would enter the lake. They are available while supplies last at the Town Hall for Edinburg residents.

#### Town of Edinburg Tax Rate

The Schenectady Gazette, on May 4th, reported that the Town of Edinburg has the lowest property tax rate, based on median home value, in the Capital Region. This was based upon an annual report by the Empire Center.



#### DID YOU KNOW THAT—

Congratulations to the Fulton County Historical Society; the Fulton County Museum and the Fulton County Historian Samantha Hall-Saladino for all their efforts in declaring 2019 "The Year of the Glove". Many presentations and programs will be given all year in Fulton County to tell the story of leather tanning and glove making.

Not only did these combined industries create a tremendous amount of jobs for folks in Fulton County for much of the 19th and 20th centuries but it overflowed into Saratoga County into the Towns of Edinburg and Day giving employment to many men and women.

Glove making couldn't have come to our communities at a more opportune time. The hemlock trees used in the tanning industry were all cut down; many tanneries had closed while others were using a newly created chemical. The area's woodenware mills had burned or closed and many of the big logging companies had moved on to Michigan and Wisconsin. Glove making didn't pay a small fortune but it helped many folks on small farms in our rural area survive and feed their families.

If one were to investigate he would find very few families that were not touched by the glove industry in some way. It is estimated that 75-85% of glove workers were women who started out working from home. Most of the men worked in the tanning and dyeing factories or the cutting of gloves in glove shops in Fulton County. The cut pieces would be bundled into full sets of gloves by the dozen. A worker from one of these many shops would deliver the bundles to the home sewers and pick up the bundles that had already been sewn.





The women who worked at home certainly had to be organized in order to get the housework done and gloves sewn as well. My grandmother Grace Olmstead got her sewing machine in 1905 for her 16th birthday. In time she married, had four children, helped run a farm and continued to sew gloves. As her children, three boys and a girl got older they helped with the housework chores such as doing dishes and canning items from the garden. This was repeated in many other local families. The Gagne kids on Military Rd. helped their mom, Ruth by turning the gloves right-side out as they were sewn wrong-side out. Ruth's mom, Myrtle Wells, who lived across the way also sewed on gloves. Another woman on Military, Myrtle Frasier, also followed this occupation. In the Town of Day Military Rd. flows into Yates Hill Rd. on which lived Helen Kenyon who sewed gloves for 30 years, first sewing at home and then at Serfis Glove Co. in Northville. Helen's specialty was the ossan or whip stitch on leather gloves.

Women often sewed into the night after their children were all tucked in.

Anna Craig, on the corner of Military and Morris,

kept a daily diary/journal for years. On Aug. 8, 1931-at the age of 51- she baked a pie, bread and a cake; cleaned and sewed (gloves). On Aug. 18, 1950-age 70-she "baked a pie, scrubbed the kitchen floor, made pickles, crocheted and sewed". Anna did beautiful crocheted work. She took orders and created items to be sold to earn extra money as well as sewing gloves. Other days she might churn and work ten pounds or more of butter and do laundry as well as sewing her gloves.

One must remember that in the 1930's or 1950's homes in Edinburg or Day did not have automatic dish washers, clothes washers or dryers or gas or electric stoves. Most country kitchens had woodburning cook stoves and to get them hot enough to bake pies, cakes or bread heated up the entire house for the rest of the day. Nor did anyone have air conditioning then either.

Anna worked for many, many years for the Alvord Glove Co. in Mayfield as did my grandmother and many other women in Edinburg and Day. On May 23, 1946 Anna indicated that Vince Alvord came to pick up 19 dozen gloves which she was paid \$17.10 (\$.90 dz.). He left 12 dozen gloves behind to be sewn. Mrs. Alvord-Vince's mom-brought her



4 plants. Glove workers were paid by piece work meaning they only sewed certain parts on a glove and someone else did the rest of the work. Women on my road Jessie Stockwell and Rhoba Robinson sewed leather gloves but my grandmother sewed fabric-jersey- gloves. AS well as working for Alvord Glove she worked for Murrall Glove Co. which was also located in Mayfield from 1918 to the late 1970's. Murrall's main product was fabric gloves.

Many of Rhoba's family were involved in glove making. Three of her daughters Beulah Dimick, Marion Nourse, Alice Morehouse and granddaughter, Beverly Morgan worked in the glove shops in Northville.

Ethel Bovee in the town of Day also sewed on leather gloves.

By the 1930's social reformers-none of whom lived in the area nor knew anything about people's lives here-pushed to stop glove making at home and have all work moved into glove shops. Reformers seem to show up with each new generation! Obviously these people couldn't see that children were better off with their mother at home even if she

were sewing than being gone all day and not home at all!

In 1941 a law was passed banning glove making homework in New York State.

Mygrandmother Olmstead decided to "beat the system". My uncles and grandfather moved the farm's unused corn house to the back corner of the farmhouse. converting it into a glove shop. Tar paper was placed on the outside of the building, then covered with board and batten siding. A sheet metal wood stove was installed inside for warmth. Grandma and my mom sewed gloves here until the

weather got very cold-then they'd quit for the winter. She used that little shop for several years! I'll never forget being in grandma's shop with the combined smell of tar paper and machine oil or standing in Rhobie's dining room with the smell of machine oil and leather.

Possibly there were exclusions for sewing at home as Anna Craig and Rhoba Robinson continued to sew "in house".

At the end of DeGolia Street in Batchellerville was a glove shop owned by the Murrall Co. of Mayfield. George "Bug" Edwards ran the shop. He also covered both sides of the Sacandaga Reservoir delivering unfinished gloves and picking up finished ones. The arrival of the auto greatly improved Bug's job of making his rounds. The arrival of electricity allowed for the electrification of sewing machines making it easier to increase glove making. As the same as working at home work in the glove shop was done by piece work. Everyone had a different job to do piece by piece and it was the same day after day, being paid for each piece.

# Flower Talk by Sally Peck

The rose is one of the most beloved of all flowers and have been revered for centuries. As Shakespeare wrote "What's in a name? That which we call a rose by any other name would smell as sweet." It didn't start with Hallmark or Florists. Rose fossils claimed to be millions of years old were found in Colorado. 5,000 years ago they were grown in China who originated the red rose while the yellow rose was discovered by accident. The original colors were shades of pink or white.

The sharp spikes on the stem of a rose known as "thorns", are actually called prickles. Roses possess a protective layer petal known as the guard petal which protects the inner flower as they bloom, and when they are cut and handled. Some florist remove the guard petals so the flowers are more appealing.

In ancient Asia Vishnu, god of India, formed his bride, Lakshmi, from 1,116 rose petals. So the early rose became a symbol of beauty.

In Greek mythology: Chloris, the Goddess of flowers created the rose by giving life to lifeless body of a nymph; Aphrodite, the Goddess of love gave her beauty and Dionysus, the God of wine

> presented her nectar to give her sweet scent; giving her charm, brightness and joy. The rose is associated with both the Greek and Roman goddesses of Love. This is the reason for its popularity with lovers

> In Rome a wild rose would be placed on the door of a room where secret matters were discussed. The phrase sub rosa, or "under the rose", means to keep a secret and is derived from this ancient Roman practice. During Roman times, the history of the rose gets a bit ugly. Peasants were required to grow roses instead of food crops in order to satisfy the demands of their rulers. They filled their pools

and fountains and rooms with petals as well as a confetti for celebrations, for perfumes and even medicinal purposes.

Cleopatra believed that rose petals were an aphrodisiac, requesting that her servants cover her bed in fresh roses each day. When she held a banquet in 42 B.C. for her lover Mark Anthony, she requested that the floors be covered in 2 feet of rose petals. (That is a lot of roses, thanks to the peasants).

During the fifteenth century, the rose developed its name the "War of the Roses". The white rose symbolised Yorkshire and the red rose Lancaster for the factions fighting to control England.

Emperor Napoleon believed that roses had powers for healing. He ordered that bags of dry rose petals be given to each of his officers. If they suffered a gunshot wound the petals were boiled in white wine and applied to the wound to treat lead poisoning

In 1986 the rose also became the floral emblem of the USA. It is the official flower of New York, Iowa, North Dakota and Georgia.

For the Christians, the rose is one of only three flowers mentioned in the Bible. During Medieval times the five petals of the rose were identified with the five wounds of Christ. The rose later became associated with the Virgin Mary as well as the Rosary, which was originally a string of 150 dried roses

Roses are in the same family as apples, which is why their fruits bear such a resemblance to them. Rose hips are the seed pods of roses—the fruit that remains after the blooms fade. Rose hips have a bit of a tarness of crab apples and are a great source of vitamin C. They are used in supplements, teas, jams and skin care.

Rose petals are most commonly used to flavor dishes in Indian, Chinese and Middle Eastern cuisine. They garnish everything from drinks to cakes. They are added to water or butter, even chocolate to infuse flavors. (Don't use rose hips or petals from plants that have been treated with pesticides).

The rose has always been a timeless symbol in history, religion, art and literature. While each color expresses love, beauty and balance a little differently, the main message is still always love!

The canoe has two seats with fore and aft decks and is finished to showcase the natural wood beauty. The hull is a sapphire blue, providing a classy finished statement.

The club, known for its building and restoring of wooden boats, has taken on another boat project thanks to the generosity of Ed Anker of Sacandaga Park. Ed needed extra space in his garage and decided that one of his four canoes had to go to make room for his car. Ed was in the process of building his fourth canoe when he decided that

the three previous ones that he built were all he needed. He decided to find a new home for the partially constructed canoe and with a suggestion from John Ferguson, a local history buff and one familiar with the Northville Rotary Club boating projects, it was donated to the Rotary Club.

The canoe will also be on display in the 4th of July Parade as well as at the Rotary Woodworking and Fine Arts Show July 19th – 21st. benefit local community projects and scholarships. Raffle ticket sales will continue throughout the Woodworking and Fine Arts Show until the winner is announced on Sunday, the 21st at the conclusion of the show.

#### Greetings from the GSLFF!

The Great Sacandaga Lake Fisheries Federation has been busy in May. On May 2nd, 4,600 trout were stocked in the lake. A nice mix of rainbow and brown trout were stocked at 6 locations around the lake in order to spread them out. From these locations, the fish will disperse throughout the lake. Fish were put in at the Town of Day boat launch, Sinclair Point, the Northville boat launch, at the HRBR Regulatory District office, at Cranberry Cove Marina, and at the Broadalbin boat launch. About 125 very excited and enthusiastic second graders from the Broadalbin Perth School District met the fish truck and federation volunteers at the DEC's Broadalbin boat launch to assist with the stocking. Fish, one at a time for a while, were put in buckets so the children could bring them to the water and release the fish. I am not sure how many fish were given "pet names" by the kids but there were guite a few. Each fish was released with care and some kids waved to them

as they swam off. The kids were educated about the lake, the fish, and why stocking is important. This is the type of outreach and education our young children need, and having the schools assist with stocking efforts, will be something the federation continues to pursue.

On May 4th, the 22nd Annual Spring Fishing Contest was held out of the Lakeside Tavern. Despite the high water, cold and wet weather, a good number of anglers hit the water. Harry Mussen, Casey Hoffman, and Mike Meilunas took the trout

Other entries for walleye were in the 19 - 16" size, which are all great fish.



#### **ARTHRITIS**

According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, approximately 54 million adults in the United States suffer from some form of arthritis, affecting 26% of women and 19.1% of men. Due


to its wearing effects, about half of those with arthritis are limited in their abilities to perform everyday tasks.

#### What is Arthritis?

The National Institute of Arthritis and Musculoskeletal and Skin Diseases defines arthritis as joint inflammation. However, the term "arthritis" can be used to classify any disorder that affects the joints. A joint occurs where two bones meet, such as your ankle, knee or elbow. There are many different kinds of arthritis but the most common forms include osteoarthritis, rheumatoid arthritis, gout, ankylosing spondylitis, psoriatic arthritis and reactive arthritis.

#### **Causes of Arthritis**

The cause of arthritis depends on the type of arthritis a person is diagnosed with. Some arthritic conditions, like osteoarthritis, are caused by everyday wear and tear on the body while others, like rheumatoid arthritis, are caused





by a flaw in the body's immune system. Research shows that certain genes can also increase the risk for developing arthritis. looking to make these camps into year round homes. Those individuals who spent years on the reservoir understood what life is like, having been through many high water and low water years. (This year is just another high year).

Eventually the secret got out about our lake. People who live or vacation here, now, come from several states and other countries. It is easy to see why people do not understand how the lake works. You have to really be here full time to Aappreciate@ what can happen on the lake, throughout the seasons. It appears that this year, more people have learned some valuable lessons. I cannot imagine a single person on this lake that has not been impacted at one time or another by some of the seasonal occurrences. We have all been NEW to this lake!

This year several individuals took to social media to answer their questions. There is nothing wrong with that but questions were often responded to in a judgmental and negative way. To better understand the lake, look into other local lake associations and educational resources for answers. Life on the lake is sometimes daunting. If you are an owner of property with beach rights you have to deal with the HRBRRD. This system has been in place since 1931 and is not likely to change anytime soon. There are a lot of stakeholders involved. Get a copy of their rules and regulations. Arm yourself with as much factual information as possible. Having beach rights bring value to your home. If you lose them, you will lose a lot of equity in your house. Become a member

of organizations such as The Sacandaga Protection Committee (SPC). Are you aware that they have been effective in supporting our exclusive use of our lake rights since 2009? Did you know that a bill made it to the Governors' desk late last summer that would shift the cost of flood control from the true beneficiaries to our community? The bill was extremely flawed but through the work of the SPC and phone calls and letters from permit holders around the lake this bill was not signed by the Governor. How many people were involved in this? Did you know that in 2014 there was an Assembly bill that would have abolished the HRBRRD and transfer authority to the New York State Power Authority? There have been many more threats over the years that have challenged our rights as permit holders. The Sacandaga Protection Committee was created as an advocacy group to ensure our voice was heard. If you want to protect your beach rights and want to be heard then you should involve your selves in the endeavors of the SPC. It is a volunteer organization that is here to protect our lake rights.

These rights are not God given and everything could change in a heart beat. They are not a funded group. Money is raised to pay for lobbyists to represent major issues on our behalf. They rely on donations from lake owners and fund raising. They have a good working relationship with the HRBRRD. They also work collaboratively with other groups of concerned lake owners. Getting advice from your neighbors or friends is fine but if you want factual information do your homework. Check out the Sacandaga Protection Committee website by going to sacandagaprotectioncommittee.org. This is where our collective voice will be heard. To learn more and be a part of this successful organization here are the 2019 event dates. These events are always a fun time!

Sunday July 14 from 1:00 to 4:00: the SPC will be hosting their annual summer fund raiser at Wally's Driftwood Park. Bring the kids and make it a family

#### **Did You Know**

Is this a lake or a reservoir? I have often talked about our company's history in the Sacandaga Valley. My great-grandfather came up with a wooden drill rig from Oklahoma to drill piling holes for the new dam. The same dam that people have been sharing pictures and complaining about on social media. Thanks to the dam, that created this lake, we are fortunate to live and play in one of the most beautiful places in the Adirondack Park. When I was a little girl, our family took Sunday rides around the reservoir. I have talked to many other people who grew up doing this too. I am not entirely sure when the name changed from Sacandaga Reservoir to the Great Sacandaga Lake. It took me years to stop saying it was a reservoir . . . even though it is.

I was also embarrassed to say we lived on the Great Sacandaga Lake when we bought our property in 1999. It just seemed, to me, that it sounded like you were just bragging.

It is important to understand the entire lake history from inception until now. The displacement

of the families and businesses in 1927 is heartbreaking. I cannot imagine living in such a time. People in the valley sacrificed their homes for the down stream flood beneficiaries. They did not understand it and, apparently, neither do some people today. Over time people living in towns of, close proximity, started to see the value of having this Aplay land@ of water available to them. Many people from the Schenectady area who worked at General Electric started building camps around the lake. They had an opportunity to get away from the summer heat in the city. Their needs were few and the idea of campfires, fishing and baths in the lake was idyllic to them. Many of these camps have been passed down through their families for generations. In the last 30 years things started to change. People were
