



DON BOWMAN REMEMBERS


Tales of the Sacandaga Valley





Saratoga County Fish Stocking



HealthLink Littauer's WELLNESS WORDS

CAN YOU SPOT THE SYMPTOMS OF STROKE?

According to the National Stroke Association, every 40 seconds someone has a stroke. Sadly, only about 30% recognize the symptoms and get to a hospital in time to prevent disability. In fact, stroke is the leading cause of disability in adults. Together let's change that...read on!

You lose approximately 2 million brain cells a minute during a stroke. Therefore, it is important that everyone become aware of stroke signs and be able to get help quickly.

BE FAST

You may have seen the FAST acronym from the American Heart Association. FAST stands for: F=FACE Ask the person to smile. Does one side of the face droop?

A=ARMS Ask the person to raise both arms. Does one drift down?

S=SPEECH Ask the person to say a simple sentence such as, "The sky is blue."

Do the words sound slurred or incomprehensible?

T=TIME If you observe any of these signs, it is time to call 911!

Do not allow anyone, especially the person with stroke signs, to drive to the hospital. Ambulance personnel are equipped to recognize stroke symptoms and relay them to the hospital immediately. Care will be faster and the emergency department will be ready to work with the patient when they arrive.

The National Stroke Association has also added BE to the acronym.

B=BALANCE Some stroke victims don't have weakness but they do have severe balance difficulties.

Do they stand with difficulty or appear to walk with difficulty?

E=EYES Some people present with vision loss in one or both eyes, or parts of the visual field are missing. Ask them to read a few words.

Once in the hospital, there are a number of possible new interventions that could reverse symptoms and/or limit further brain damage. However, these interventions are severely time limited. So recognition and quick action are the key to good outcomes.

Should a stroke survivor be left with disability, there are plenty of services available help to reduce and/or compensate for any deficits the stroke survivor has. A team approach is usually the treatment

of choice. The patient may have physical therapy, occupational therapy, speech therapy, and/or recreational therapy depending on the needs identified. Once again, the sooner therapy is started the better the outcomes.

A stroke affects not only the stroke survivor, but also family members and other caregivers. Rehabilitation cannot reverse brain damage, but it can help the brain learn new ways of doing things so that people can achieve the best possible long-term outcomes.







our first "Historic Edinburgh Day". After many months of hard work by many Edinburg folks we celebrated Rural Museum Dedication Day on June 27, 1992. Even former Sen. Hugh Farley was on hand to give us a word of praise.

The building, originally a barn, is located on property that in the 1850's was part of the farm owned by Joseph and Jemima Covell. The farmhouse still stands directly across the road. The farm had several owners over the years and in 1930 the Town of Edinburg purchased the barn from Harold V. and Rosena Wessells. Rosena was the sister of our first town historian, Nellie Tyrrell.

The barn was converted into the town's highway barn. It remained the highway barn until 1974 when the new town hall/barn complex was built at its present site on Military Road. The barn continued to be used for storage by the town and fire company until 1990 when thanks to our town supervisor, Jean Raymond, with help from Senator Farley, a grant was obtained to convert the building into our Rural Museum. This was a long-time dream of former town historian Nellie Tyrrell and local businessman Victor Brownell.

The highway crew and firemen cleaned out what they wanted leaving the rest for us. Jean

arranged for prisoners from the former Wilton Correctional Facility to help us with the heavy lifting while 3-4 of us made the decision as to what to save and what to throw away. A concrete floor was poured and an up-to-date electrical service was installed. Windows were replaced or repaired, a new entry door installed and some painting done. The guard in charge of the inmates was a good carpenter and he and Edinburg resident Fred Trudy installed the railings and gates for several exhibit areas.

After the heavy duty work was finished we set up work days to clean, set up exhibits, etc. Many folks showed up-young and old



alike-not all historical society members either. We had a wonderful time and accomplished so much! We'd go to the firehouse with our bag lunches, eat, relax, breathe some fresh air-then back to work.

A 46- page "Historic Edinburg" booklet was put together with historic articles and photos. Ads paid for the booklets which were sold for the benefit of the Edinburg Historical Society. Boy scout Aaron Frasier chose the Rural Museum to complete his Eagle Scout project. Aaron made many stand-alone wooden signs which were used to identify many items within the museum. A great job well done, many of these signs are still in use while the rest are stored.

Letters were sent out to all contacts we could think of that would be willing to demonstrate old-time crafts as well as music makers. A wonderful response was received. We had a self-guided tour of Beecher Hollow; the model railroad crew gave demonstrations in the old Sumner's house behind Fuller's Store; the Methodist Church had a "yummy" strawberry festival and the emergency squad offered a blood pressure clinic. There were airplane rides at the airport, white elephant sales

and bake sales.

In the middle of the quilt show (41 in all) at the firehouse were sisters, Vivien Beirlein of Northville and Maxine Stuk of Gloversville. Maxine and Vivien, in mop caps and shawls spent the day stitching up a storm in the age-old art of quilting.

At the Rural Museum were Gene Valk, hand weaver and Libby VanNostrand, spinner. Neither of these gals were strangers to Edinburg since Libby is a native now living in Mayfield and Gene of Gloversville is a descendant of Edinburg's Albro and Grinnell families. Instead of bringing her regular 4-shaft floor loom Gene worked all day on her inkle loom. Inkle weaving produces beautiful narrow tapes that can be used as bracelets, belts, camera straps, suspenders and other useful items. Libby was becoming known in the area for her dying of wool with Kool-Aid and spinning dog hair into yarn. She is also an accomplished knitter having completed a pair of wool long-johns which she had on display.

All of the above ladies could often be found at historical functions in the tri-county area of Fulton, Montgomery and Saratoga.

Bruce Frasier, master soap-maker of Edinburg, was not in attendance simply because we could not supply him with a stove to produce his wares. Bruce was kind enough to supply us with a box of soap samples and the recipe for anyone interested in making their own.

Steve Gleeman, our local plumber by day, sweltered over his blacksmith forge and tools. A newcomer to demonstrations Steve turned out fireplace tools, dinner bells, all kinds of hooks, beautiful antique door latches and hinges, etc.

Down the road by the Nellie Tyrrell Museum were our musicians of the day. If you have never


