





## Local Farmers Markets are Opening

The Fulton Montgomery Farmers Market Association (FMFMA), has announced the opening of their farmers markets for the 2018 season. Currently, the association runs 3 different summer markets: one in Johnstown, one in Gloversville, and a new one that will be opening in Caroga Lake

The Johnstown market is held on Tuesday afternoons, from 3pm-6pm, and is in the city park on west main street, and the market will open for the season on June 12th, and will run through midoctober (depending on the weather).

The Gloversville market, which is held Saturday mornings from 8:30am -12:30pm, will open on May 5h, and will run through mid-october, also depending on the weather. The opening will also be in conjunction with the Spring Festival which is being put on by the Center For Regional Growth. The festival will include the vendors from the farmers market, as well as representatives from community groups. We will have live music, as well as food, so come and join the festivities for the day.

Our newest market will be at Caroga Lake, at the corner of Route 10, and Caroga Lake Shore Road, right across the street from the post office. (Yes this is the old Shermans Amusement Park!) The market will be on Friday nights from 3pm-6pm, and will open on June 29th, running through September 14th.

All of the FMFMA markets are 100% producer markets, which means that all the products that you see offered at the markets, have to be raised, made, or grown by that vendor, so you will be talking to the person that actually grew the product!. #### New York State BURN BAN

The NYS Department of Conservation has a ban in place on open burning through May 14th. Any open burning in Edinburg requires a permit from DEC. If you are burning during the ban you can receive an appearance ticket and will be subject to a fine. Please contact DEC for additional information.

#### Tour de Cure

The Saratoga Diabetes Association is holding their Tour de Cure fundraiser, which is a series of bicycle tours in Saratoga County, on June 10th. This year they have a 100 mile route that will include the South Shore Road from Providence to the Batchellerville Bridge and then over the bridge to the Four Corners and then North Shore Road to the Town of Day. The scheduled hours are 6:00am-4:00pm.

### New York State Budget Highway Funding

The regular CHIPS Highway aid was in the Governor's budget proposal but the additional Extreme Winter Recovery aid that had been budgeted in recent year's state budgets was not included. The final adopted state budget restored those funds. Edinburg will receive an additional \$15,969.70 that was we had not budgeted. That will bring the total state funding for paving to \$118,940.69.

#### Historic Edinburgh Day

The Edinburg Historical Society decided not to hold Edinburgh Day this year due to a lot of work they are undertaking at the museums. A group from the Methodist Church is organizing a "Community Day" instead. Linda Hurst is organizing other groups to have events and they have selected Saturday, July 14th as the date. The town will again supply the horse and wagon rides and as the activities and plans are finalized they will be publicized.



Tuesday, May 15 is voting day for the Northville Public Library. The library's Board of Trustees has worked to develop a responsible budget with the least impact on our local taxpayers. The 2018-2019 budget will have no increase. Voting on two Trustee seats will be held.

Nearly 17,000 visitors passed through the library in the last year, using 30,000 items, including digital resources as well. The library's computers and wireless network were accessed over 3,300 times, and the library handled about 7,700 transfers, sharing items between area libraries. Nearly 85 programs were held for Preschool children through senior citizens.


## Edinburg Historical Society



Last month, we provided information updates on boating fatalities, the fact that drowning was the leading type of boating death and warnings about cold water immersion. We had anticipated that the summer season would be underway before our next installment. Sorry, we have not reached that point but we are hoping! However, our message is the same – "STAY OUT OF THE COLD WATER!"

#### SAFE LAKE 'SPRING' WATCH

Our SAFE LAKE Initiative partners are preparing for the current season. The Great Sacandaga Lake Association will soon release the calendar of boater safety classes and is e-mailing information alerts on the lake level to its membership as well as links to safety videos. In addition, the United States Power Squadron – Sacandaga Power Squadron, shared the latest on a new website which was developed nationally and recently became available on-line. 

## Tanneries of the Sacandaga Valley part 2

Leaving the Lynnwood tannery at Conklingville we travel upriver to West Day where the town lines of Day and Edinburgh meet. In the mountains to the north Sand Lake flows into Sand Creek which flows to the Sacandaga River(now Great Sacandaga Lake at the Town of Day park). If one takes the Military Road to the intersection of Sand Lake Road, turning north on Sand Lake Road; following this a short distance beyond the Town of Day line you'll come to the remains of the Croweville tannery on the banks of Sand Creek. The tannery was built in 1856 by a William Fowler. Two men: Patrick Crowe and Patrick Kyne purchased the tannery in 1859.

The little hamlet that had grown up around the tannery was called Croweville. There were over

a dozen dwellings housing app. 90 people. There was also a school at the end of the road which still stands having been converted into a home many years ago. A couple of miles down the road on Military stood the Edinburg Hill Methodist Church which served the folks in Croweville and the ones over the hill at the woodenware community of Tennantville. Tennantville also supplied the Croweville tannery with much of its hemlock bark.

The Croweville tannery buildings were 52 ft X300 ft and 2 stories high. It was powered by one 12hp central-discharge water wheel and a 60hp engine with 4 boilers. It used about 1500 cord of hemlock bark annually to tan the hides. Smaller than Conkling's tannery at Conklingville the business employed 20 men, processing 8000 hides and turning out 145 tons of sole leather valued at \$60,000 annually. The business was purchased in 1865 by Henry Poor & Son of Boston, the same company that bought out the Lynnwood tannery in 1863. Former owner Patrick Kyne stayed on as a bookkeeper with the new owners. The Croweville tannery was still in operation in 1878 with Lewis E. Wait as supervisor.

As we travel up the river we come to the spot where Beecher Creek flowed into the Sacandaga(now near the Edinburg Marina). Roughly a mile up the creek stood one of the earliest tanneries in the valley—Edinburgh's Beecher Hollow tannery. Just below the stone bridge on the south bank of Beecher Creek stood a large building that started out in 1802 as a distilley, continuing until 1825 when it became the Lyon & Prindle tannery. After several owners the business was purchased in or about 1855 by George F. Cameron. Cameron invested \$800 in real estate and \$100 in tools and machines. He had 1000 hides worth \$1000 in raw materials. He employed one man and his finished product for the




year was the tanning of 1000 hides worth \$2000.

In 1870 Cameron had \$2500 invested in the business, employed two men and had 3 milling machines; one each for hide, bark and pumping. His raw materials consisted of 35 cord of hemlock bark worth \$175; 6000 hides worth \$540, 60 gal. of oil and \$15 worth of lime and tallow. His production was 2916 ft of leather worth \$700. 20 furs and 714 shoes worth \$300. The tannery also made shoes and boots. The soles were

attached with tiny wooden pegs made at a mill in Batchellerville. Cameron also did some custom tanning that brought a profit of \$200. This mill also operated 12 months of the year.

One might note that water-powered mills in the very early days of our country only operated for 8 months of the year due to the icing over of streams in the winter months. The other 4 months were spent gathering the necessary logs and bark to keep the mills operating in warmer weather.

I found an interesting entry in an old journal. On Dec. 3, 1867 my husband's great grandfather Ela Wilbur made an entry in his journal. Apparently Ela had butchered a beef critter and sold a quarter of it to Dr. Kies, the local doctor. Ela received eleven cents per pound for the 97lbs of beef. Ela also wrote that he had one 38 lb. hide left which he took to George Cameron to be tanned at seven cents per pound.

Cameron's tannery was small compared to other

tanneries and was still in business in 1878.

As we proceed upriver the Sacandaga leaves the Town of Edinburgh and entered the Town of Northampton. Northampton had many sawmills over the years but I found no evidence of any tanneries.

A short distance above Northville East Stony Creek in the Town of Hope in Hamilton County flowed into the Sacandaga River. In this area on the old Northville Road one will find the road that leads up along East Stony Creek into Hope Falls. In the 1840's this settlement was a hustling, bustling community with plenty of people, several sawmills, 2 tanneries, a post office and a school house.

Smith & Company started the first tannery in 1845. In 1848 ownership became Smith, Slocum & Co. The business re-organized in 1849 as Smith & Resseguie with John Resseguie and Patrick Crowe joining Smith. Crowe had started the Wells tannery with Patrick Hanley in 1845. Smith and Resseguie continued to purchase acres of forestland especially that which contained

standing hemlock timber.

Businesses were doing so well in Hope Falls that in 1851 the first bank in Hamilton County was organized in Hope Falls with Patrick Crowe as president. Unfortunately the bank only operated a couple of years before closing.

In 1859 Patrick Crowe sold his share in the business to Smith and Resseguie for \$20,000. Crowe had moved to the Town of Day and purchased the



Croweville tannery while still owning the tannery in Wells. It would seem that Crowe wanted a finger in every pie! From 1867-1871 he was also the Hamilton County treasurer.

The 2nd tannery in Hope Falls was also started in the 1840's by Orra Brownell. In 1855 the business was known as Orra Brownell & Sons as four-Robert, Orra Jr., John, Ira- of Orra's six sons became old enough to join the company. At this time part of a mortgage on the business was held by a New York City leather business, Brown & Sherwood. When Orra Sr. passed away a younger son, Lewis took charge of the business with older brothers John, Orra Jr. and Robert becoming Lewis Brownell & Brothers in 1875; purchasing Smith & Co. in 1876. The Brownell brothers advertising sign should have read "Local boys make good" as they successfully ran the tannery into the 1890's.



After some absence, the Edinburg Fire Department has returned to the Edinburg News. Each month we will be recalling a portion of the history of this Department, reporting on current fire call statistics, or advising you on upcoming events and how you can contribute to this critical emergency response organization.

In this article, we will review some of the alarm statistics for 2017, a year which was a rather busy one. The Fire Department responded to 124 calls, of which 57 were mutual – aid assisting other fire departments.

Of these: 30 were to Northville and 21 to Providence, with whom we currently have automatic mutual- aid agreements regarding certain types of calls. Conversely, we received mutual – aid support from several departments 36 times, with Northville responding 29 and Providence 17, respectively.

In 2017 with the District there were: 11 Fire Calls, consisting of: 6 structure, 2 chimney, 3 brush. Service Calls, which cover a wide variety of responses totaled 44. These calls were primarily: motor vehicle accidents 8, EMS

> assistance 11, and downed power lines 14. There were 12 Non-Emergency Calls, of which 11 were for false automatic fire alarm. activations.

Overall, the Edinburg Fire Department had a very active year. We look forward to protecting your family and property throughout 2018. We conduct drills or have our monthly business meeting on Tuesday evenings. We encourage you as neighbors to stop by for a visit. Potential new members are always welcome.


On tour from Quebec, Canada ,they are five seasoned musicians, all of whom are

# STEM:


In STEM the students have been using Sphero robots. Spheros are app-enabled robots that go beyond just code with collaborative STEM activities, nurturing students' imaginations in ways that many other educational programs cannot. So far, students have programmed their robots to transmit both analog and digital messages over various distances, study and draw constellations of the night sky, and navigate over bridges, through tunnels and mazes in order to reach 'victims' of a natural disaster. Using the Spheros has sparked the curiosity of students, demanded problem solvings skills, and fostered the need for constant modifications of proposed design solutions.

# 3-6 SOCIAL STUDIES:

The presentation "A Soldier's Life" brought the experiences of Revolutionary War soldiers at Fort Ticonderoga and the battlefield to the ECS classroom.
