





Young Eagles Flight Rally

Area young people ages 8-17 will have a chance to take to the skies on Saturday, Septenber 10 (rain date Sun.11th), as

Experimental Aircraft Association EAA Chapter 602 hosts a Young Eagles Flight Rally at Fulton County Airport.

The rally is part of the EAA Young Eagles Program, created to interest young people in aviation. Since the program was launched in 1992, Volunteer EAA pilots have flown more than 1.4 million young people who reside in more than 90 countries.

"Free airplane rides are just part of the Flight Rally," said Doug Sterling, spokesman for the event. "We hope to build one-to-one relationships between pilots and young people, giving a new generation a chance to learn more about the possibilities that exist in the world of aviation."

Pilots at the event will also explain more about their airplanes allowing young people to discover how airplanes work and how pilots ensure safety is the prime concern before every flight.

Following the flight, each young person, will

receive a certificate making them an official Young Eagle. Their name will then be entered into the "World's Largest Logbook," which is on permanent display at the EAA Air Adventure Museum in Oshkosh, WI. The Logbook is also accessible on the web at www.youngeagles.

Along with flight rallies, EAA members also fly Young Eagles on an individual basis. Each pilot volunteers their time and aircraft so the flights can be provided free of charge for interested young people.

Those attending the flight rally on September 10th are asked to come to Fulton County Airport, starting at 9am to register for their flight. Flights will begin at 9:30am, with registration closing at 2pm.

Parent or guardian must attend with child.



Local Law on Games of Chance

Upon the request of the Edinburg Emergency Squad the Town Board has approved a Local Law that will allow pull tabs to be sold at the Emergency Squad weekly Bingo games. This local law is subject to voter approval at the General Election on November 8th.

Highway Budget Amended to Add PAVE-NY Funds

The New York State Budget included \$100,000,000 in additional highway funding under a PAVE-NY program. The Town of Edinburg share is \$19057.26. Due to the receipt of the additional funds the Highway Department will be paving Sand Creek Road this year.

Junk Car Program

The town is exploring the possibility of a program to provide removal of junk cars, on a voluntary basis, by our residents. Letters have been sent to the APA, DEC and DMV requesting information on permits, rules and regulations, the process to dispose of vehicles without titles and registrations as well as information on registered and licensed junk yards and towing companies in our area. We received some information from the Saratoga County Clerk and a contact at DMV for additional information. We are waiting for answers from the others.


Cooperstown, N.Y. and the Lake Placid Lodge.




Cycle Adirondacks Event Coming to Northville 250 Cyclists and Adventure Travelers to Stay In and Walk the Village Aug. 26







Steward Program's work in preventing the entry of invasive species into the lake. Chairman Hughes concluded by inviting applications from tax exempt or government entities for lake Settlement monies administered by the GSLAC. (More information is available from the GSLAC.)

Bob Jones from the Sacandaga Protection Committee (SPC) reviewed progress made by the SPC as well as the latest schedule for SPC fundraising in the lake community. The SPC announced a \$15,000 raffle to support the group's "...work in protecting the environmental, economic and legal interest of the entire Great Sacandaga Lake community." The newly-elected Sheriff of Fulton County, Richard Giardino, was thanked for listening to Association member concerns for the revival of the lake patrol. The Sheriff began his presentation by reminding the GSLA members that they provided the initial financial contribution for the return of the lake patrols. He emphasized that this contribution made it possible for him to receive other donations on his way to make the lake patrols a reality this summer. Long-time resident and GSLA member, Sheriff Giardino, spoke at length about the recent drownings on the lake and the compassion necessary in those trying situations. promised increased services to the lake community as additional resources became available.

The Most Essential Ingredient!

In case you hope to squeeze in one last picnic before the leaves turn, here is a recipe you might like to add to your picnic menu. Several have requested this recipe from me this summer, so I decided to just give it to everyone who reads the well-known and popular Edinburg Newsletter.

Baked Pineapple

4 eggs lightly beaten with a whisk

34 cup white sugar

1 stick of butter softened (you must use real butter!)

1 cup of canned crushed pineapple (with the juice)

5 slices of white bread (cubed, crusts too. I have even used hotdog rolls when I have no white bread on hand.

I figure one roll is equal to 1 slice of bread)

Stir everything together making sure the bread is completely covered with the egg/pineapple mixture. Pour mixture into a sprayed medium casserole dish. Bake at 350 degrees for 45 min. Serve hot. I usually triple this recipe for our family of 28 and make it in a 9 X 13 glass

pan. (This is NOT a good recipe if you are counting your carbs and calories!)

Baked Pineapple is one of our family's favorites and besides making it for almost every picnic and church potluck, I also make it at Eastertime as it is a nice side dish with our ham dinner. I must share this story with you. While eating our Easter dinner one year our son-in-law Charlie said, "Hey Ma, I don't taste any pineapple in the Baked Pineapple?" I looked at him with a surprised look and said, "Oh no, I forgot to add the pineapple!" (Which is the most essential ingredient of Baked Pineapple!) Of course, everyone started laughing and Charlie

FRUITS AND VEGGIES FOR YOUR HEALTH

Harvest time in Upstate NY is one of the best times of the year! From June strawberries to fall pumpkins, we enjoy an abundance of homegrown fruits and vegetables. Farmer's markets appear in Gloversville, Johnstown and Amsterdam, and little stands of fresh picked sweet corn and other veggies appear everywhere making getting a supply affordable.

You've heard it before – we are just not eating enough fruits and vegetables. U.S. Dietary Guidelines call for 3-5 servings of vegetables and 3-4 servings of fruit each day. But the fact is, less than 30% of us – that's 7 out of 10 Americans – are failing to meet these basic guidelines. Think about it...we are actually being asked to eat more of something. How often do you hear that?

Why not start a new habit during this time of abundance. It is easy to get all the nutrients

Breakfast

Top French toast or waffles with berries or slices of banana or kiwi fruit.

Fill an omelet or scrambled eggs with mushrooms, onions, zucchini and/or spinach.

Add fresh fruit to yogurt or cereal.

Lunch

Replace half the meat in a sandwich with extra slices of tomato and leafy lettuce.

Add fruit slices or grapes to any green salad. Make peanut butter sandwiches with slices of apple or pear instead of jelly.

Top a baked potato with broccoli or homemade salsa instead of butter or sour cream.

Add your favorite chopped fruits or veggies to tuna or chicken salad.

Dinner

Garnish a filet of sole with grapes, or add fresh pineapple to grilled chicken.

Finely chop any type of vegetable then sauté and add to lasagna.

Stuff meatloaf with celery, onions, carrots and lentils.

Spray fresh veggies lightly with olive oil and roast them in a 400 degree oven or grill them on skewers.

Grill stone fruit like peaches, nectarines and plums for dessert.

Kripalu Center for Yoga & Health Awards Teaching for Diversity Grant to Transitions

Transitions, a program that supports young adults who have autism and other learning differences as they attend college, start a career and live independently for the first time, is a perfect partner for her and the programming this grant funds. Antonucci recognizes the benefits of a yoga practice for all individuals, including those with special needs. When Transitions opened in 2015, they developed a program to offer yoga opportunities in the studio available to them at the Paul Nigra Center for Creative Arts. With the support of the Kripalu scholarship grant, this program will continue throughout 2016.

The students who attend Transitions learn breathing, movement and relaxation techniques that promote overall health, which is an important part of the Transitions curriculum. The yoga program has helped them in immeasurable ways by improving their focus and helping them manage the many responsibilities they face as busy young adults. College student and Transitions Apprentice Coty Rulison said, "Yoga helps take all the stress away from the demands of the classes and calms me so I can better focus on my homework and goals." Bethany Sweet, another Transitions Apprentice, agreed, saying, "The breathing techniques have really helped me destress and feel grounded in my busy life."

Upon the success of the Transitions yoga program, Antonucci suggested an application to the Teaching for Diversity fund through Kripalu to expand the offerings to more individuals. The grant was awarded in April and the classes continue to be offered by Antonucci at Transitions. Antonucci hopes to encourage the students to practice yoga daily, and she would like to see them become yoga instructors and share the benefits of yoga with others who have challenges similar to theirs.

About Transitions

Transitions is a supportive Apprenticeship for young men and women with autism spectrum disorders including Asperger's syndrome, ADHD, dyslexia, nonverbal learning disabilities, visual or hearing impairments, medical conditions and other learning differences who want to attend college and/or prepare for a career, but may require academic, social, medical and/or emotional support.

The Transitions program's curriculum focuses on building academic, employment, life and general independence skills. Full-year College and Career Apprenticeship programs are offered, as well as a three-week Summer Immersion Experience. Visit www. transitionsusa.org for more information.






