



DON BOWMAN REMEMBERS

Tales of the Sacandaga Valley

Many years ago we had a column titled Don Bowman Remembers. It was written by a gentleman who lived in this area for many years, and worked on the dam and bridge. He lived in a bygone era of simpler times and strong resourceful people. We have access to many stories of the time and have decided to start printing them in our publication again.

I hope you enjoy them as much as we do.

The Valley Indians

The Valley Indians were independent, secretive souls. Impervious to most white men's blandishments. So it did not pay to be full of curiosity. They usually would not answer a question just on general principles. Stoic was the word. I heard an old Indian saying, "Three men can keep a secret only if two are safely dead."

The Indians call the Northern Lights "campfires of the dead." When I would visit the Indian camp on Fox Hill, the red men did not put a grave stone or wood headboard marker to indicate who was buried there. They believed that death robbed a body of it's value. Identity was lost with the departing spirit.

Near Osborn Bridge near the edge of the Valley, I remember seeing an old Indian woman standing at a cooking fire. Her crinkled face looked like a dried apple. When there was even a small gathering of people, there was a mixture of cooking meats. Everyone brought what they had. Nobody held back anything. Venison, bear meat, rabbit, fish, sausage, partridge, even some dove breasts and chicken.

Just about always the red men wore some sort of hat. Indian women wore a head scarf or some sort of covering all the time.

The Hangin' Chicken Thief

On a Sunday morning they found Festus the Jailbird Chicken Thief hangin' from a rope from the limb of a basswood tree in the buryin' ground of the church in Osborn Bridge village. The Constable, Pastor and State Police first thought that it was a lynchin'. Bur the investigation showed different. It was decided that Festus had gotten drunk on Saturday night as he was wont to do, had too much to drink and hung himself.

As was the custom with suicides, blacks and Indians all were buried outside the fence in the rear. Oh, if an Indian had become a convert, a Christian, then burial could be in a grave inside the fence.

That's the way it was. When all the valley graves were dug up and remains transported to resting places above high waters, then there was no never mind. All were treated as equal.

The Bible

We entered a house in Denton, like so many other houses in the Valley the folks had left behind furniture and many other things. After all, not much could be packed on a one horse wagon besides beds, mattresses, cookware, dishes and clothes.

Lou picked up a worn Bible which he opened. "This Bible," he read, "belonged to a Grandmother. It has the date written down when it was given to her, her name, date of marriage, the births of her children were all recorded here."

"As are the deaths of her and children it was continued by the youngest daughter who continued entries, and her marriage. This is a part of Valley history of this family that settled here. It is almost sacred in my mind."

Then he added, "I shall take it along. Perhaps someday I shall wed and have a family history to be entered in the pages of this holy book."



REMINDER Frontier Telephone Area Code Overlay

Reprinted from April 2017 Newsletter Frontier will be adding an additional area code 838, in the 518 service area. This will be done with an overlay which will require all numbers dialed in 518 & 838 to be dialed using all 10 numbers, area code plus the 7 digit number. Effective March 18th you may begin dialing 10 digits and beginning August 19th you MUST use all 10 digits. You will have to be certain that all stored numbers, in cell phones, fax machines, alarm systems etc. contain all 10 digits. All printed materials that contain a phone number will have to include the area code.

Boater Safety Classes

The GSLA is quite proud of our boater safety program. After many years of having only a single teacher, this season, Mark McDonnell, completed his training as an instructor and after a last observation report, has been approved by New York State to provide the courses.

Mark who is an experienced sail boater graduated 22 new 'safe boaters' on July 8, 2017 and has added an additional class for July 22 at the Mayfield Fire Hall. Our thanks to our hosts for providing the facilities and thanks to Mark for joining the GSLA Board and taking a hands-on approach to our mission.

We remind all boaters that New York State requires that anyone born after May 1, 1996 must have a boating safety certificate to operate a motorboat. Personal watercraft operators must be at least 14 years of age and hold a boating safety certificate.

Some quick questions: what are the personal flotation device requirements for children under

the age of 12; how many visual distress signals do I need; how many fire extinguishers are required; and what type of vessel needs to be registered? If you are not quite sure follow STEP #1 below!

TICKS: SUMMER PESTS WITH SERIOUS CONSEQUENCES

Summer has arrived in all its glory. We relish the warm weather and the many outdoor activities it allows. However, we must also contend with some of the pests of the season. Bugs and flying insects can become very annoying, bees and wasps are often frightening, and we won't even talk about ants!

There is another common summer pest than can be much more than a nuisance. Certain species of ticks found in our area can carry Lyme and other diseases. Cornell University researchers published a recent study that found Lyme disease in the Northeastern U.S. is rising at significant rates. This disease can be severe and sometimes fatal, but there are steps we can take to protect ourselves from coming into contact with these summer pests.

Ticks live in shady, moist areas at ground level. They also cling to tall grasses, brush and shrubs no more than 12-18 inches off the ground. Ticks are most prevalent from April through September with August and September being peak season. There are many species of ticks but the black legged tick is the one that carries Lyme disease. These ticks are about the size of a poppy seeds to sesame seeds. They are much smaller than the also common dog-tick.

In order to protect ourselves from ticks, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention recommends:

- 1. Wear light colored long pants and long sleeved shirts, closed toe shoes, and tuck the legs of the pants into your socks.
- 2. Use bug spray 20% or greater DEET is recommended. Do not spray repellent under clothes.
- 3. Treat clothing with a product containing permethrin. Do not spray it on your skin.
- 4. Stay on cleared, well-traveled trails and avoid dense woods and bushy areas.
- 5. Avoid sitting directly on the ground or stone walls.
- 6. Keep long hair tied back.
- 7. Check for ticks after being outdoors. Do a full body check

(especially warm areas) and bathe as soon as possible.

8. Check your animals for ticks.

How to safely remove a tick:

- 1. Use finetipped tweezers to grasp the tick as close to the skin as possible.
- 2. Pull upward with steady, even pressure. Don't twist or jerk the tick.
- 3. After removing it, thoroughly clean the bite area and your hands with rubbing alcohol or warm, soapy water.


4. Dispose of the tick by submersing it in alcohol, wrap it in tape or flush it. DO NOT crush the tick with your fingers.

If you develop a rash or flu-like symptoms with a fever up to several weeks after being bitten, be sure to contact your physician. Tell your provider about your recent tick bite, when it occurred and where you most likely acquired the tick. It is important for you and your family to be tick-free to prevent Lyme disease. Being vigilant is your best prevention!

HISTORY

While a fine accounting of the church's history was published by Pricilla Edwards, Edinburg historian in last month's Edinburg Newsletter, the August 6th Program will include Priscilla presenting a keynote talk on the church's founding and very interesting subsequent history. Just a few historical highlights that we found from printed articles found in the church's narthex, are presented below:

"During the spring of 1866, a subscription was circulated for the purpose of building a new



house of worship at Batchellerville. All responded liberally, a large sum was raised and it was decided to go forward. The work progressed 'mid great enthusiasm, all bending their best energies to the cause."

"The building arose like magic, and the bell came and was placed beneath the dome; on a beautiful afternoon in the autumn of 1866, the glad tones of a church bell broke upon the long silence. What a song of thanksgiving then arose from many hearts!" (side note: the church was formally completed in 1867)

"The drive for the new church had been started by John P. Conkling, the son of Gurdon Conkling, the founder of Conklingville. Solicitors were appointed, the plans were made, and soon all members were approached for donations. Along with Conkling worked James Goodwin, one of the original 21; he like the others, put much effort into the new church. The contractor drew up his plans and submitted them along with his estimate





of \$8,000, which did not include the bell. The membership approved the plans, and also placed an order with the Meneely Bell Foundry located in Troy, N.Y. The price for this bell was a little over \$500."

"Batchellerville Presbyterian church, one of the oldest religious organizations in the State, with a church building dating from 1867, was rededicated, following removal from the site it occupied for 64 years to make way for the new Sacandaga Reservoir." "Significant dates in the Church's latter history include: 1959, when the Presbyterians of Batchellerville and Northville

became a united congregation; 1996, when the church was placed on the registry of American Presbyterian/Reformed historic places; 2000, when the church was placed on the State and National registries of historic places; and 2004, when it received the Adirondack Architectural Heritage award.







We still have a few openings for out of district students in grades DK, PK, K, and 3. Recently, an out of district parent asked me what makes Edinburg Common School Special? My response was, "It is the staff/student connections and a willingness to constantly evolve and change instruction if it is best for our students." In Edinburg Common School, every staff member gets to know every single student. You walk the hallways and you will see everyone interacting positively, adults and children alike. You can also feel the positive energy at grade level showcase events, concerts, and just viewing the student work that adorns our hallway.

We care about your child's character and their social-emotional well-being as much as we care about their academic needs and interests.

Our district was one of the first to pilot the Computer Based State Testing last year due to having one to one devices for students, we are on the cutting edge of instruction right now as we continue to focus on research, training and implementation of additional Student Centered, Project Based Learning. Staff are continuing professional development in order to ensure a conceptual understanding of the standards and how to assess them beyond the traditional paper/pencil test in all content areas.

We are striving over the next few years to develop and provide real-life, application and high levels of collaboration and problem solving at all grade levels.

We will also be working on further developing our writing program and ensuring that both reading and writing take place in all content areas.

WHAT IS PBL?

Project Based Learning is an instructional approach that combines authentic learning experiences with content and Common Core Learning Standards (CCLS), and essential communication, collaboration, critical thinking, and self-management skills required for college, career and citizenship readiness. A project is comprised of eight essential components. (Challenging problem or question, Reflection, Sustained Inquiry, Authenticity, Voice and Choice, Key knowledge and understanding of skills, Critique and revision, and shared public product.)



COMMUNITY RELATIONSHIPS:

We have been developing a wonderful relationship with the Sacandaga Senior Center and Edinburg EMS throughout the past two school years. We hope to continue to grow those relationships, while also adding additional relationship building with the Historical Society, Fire Company



and Town of Edinburg. "It takes a village" is not a cliché, it is a reality. Whenever everyone works together, the results are more effective and the load lighter.

We open our building to scouting groups, PTO meetings and events, Northville basketball practices, travel teams, recreational volleyball for adults, all pending submission and approval of a facilities request and the available space to accommodate the request.

Edinburg Common School seeks to be fiscally responsible by sharing and/or outsourcing services to the Town of Edinburg, Northville Central School District, Broadalbin Central School District, Catholic Charities and HFM BOCES.


